The MHSE will help you expand and apply newly learned knowledge and skills in the areas of educational pedagogy, educational research, and interprofessional leadership in your workplace.

The MHSE provides opportunities for practical application of the coursework into your workplace context. Work with an interprofessional community of health educators to:

- consider the challenges and opportunities in 21st century health sciences education
- explore emergent, evidence-based research in health sciences education
- experience new technologies used in teaching, research and practice such as simulations and digital media.

Transform your health education practice.

The Master of Education in Health Sciences Education (MHSE) is an online, part-time program designed for working health professionals looking to build knowledge in areas of educational practice relevant to their professional context.

The program uses a cohort model to optimize the professional learning experience. Join an interprofessional cohort in virtual live classes. This is a course-based program that can be completed in two-and-a-half years.

The MHSE consists of eleven graduate-level three-credit courses:

- eight required courses, completed in sequence
- two electives taken at the student's discretion
- the final course is a directed research project (EDHS 903)
