

Occupational therapists who work in stroke rehabilitation are needed for a research study that is exploring the potential use of mobile applications (apps) as part of their clinical practice

Are you an occupational therapist (OT) who:

- Provides stroke rehabilitation?
- Addresses returning to driving as an intervention goal?
- Have access to an iPad tablet (and the internet)?

We invite you to participate in a study that will explore the perspectives of occupational therapists who work with individuals with stroke and their caregivers. We are investigating the clinician perspective of the feasibility of using technologies, like iPads, and mobile applications (apps) to facilitate the recovery of everyday activities, such as driving, after stroke. If you agree to participate in this study, you will be asked to complete the following:

- 1) Fill in a questionnaire that asks about your clinical experience
- 2) Watch a video (15 min) that will provide an overview of the study and introduce you to an example of a mobile app (i.e., DriveFocus) used to address the occupation of driving. Then download and explore DriveFocus, which is provided to you free of charge.
- 3) Participate in an interview (30-40 min) either by Zoom or telephone where we will explore your perspective with regard to feasibility and practice implications of using mobile software applications, like DriveFocus, as part of your occupational therapy in stroke rehabilitation.
